National Clean Air Day

National Clean Air Day is an annual campaign organised by Global Action Plan and happens on the third Thursday in June – this year it is taking place on 19th June.

Air pollution is one of the most significant environmental health risks facing people today, especially in towns and cities. Air pollution can cause a number of health issues in children, for example heart and lung diseases, deficient lung development or low birth weight. It has also been found to contribute to [mental health issues](#). Air pollution causes up to 36,000 deaths in the UK annually.

National Clear Air Day aims to:

- Improve public understanding of air pollution, both indoors and outdoors.
- Build awareness of how air pollution affects our health.
- Explain some of the easy things we can all do to tackle air pollution.

On National Clean Air Day, a simple action you could take to support the cause might be to use public transport, or a bicycle, rather than travel by car.

We will be having an assembly on 19th June to talk to the children about Clean Air Day and what they can do to help the environment.

We know that a strong connection between home and school is key to every child's success. That's why we're proud to have a dedicated Home School Link Worker (HSLW) as part of our team. Our HSLW is here to support not just children, but families too. Whether you're facing challenges at home, need help navigating school processes, or just want someone to talk to, our HSLW is a friendly and understanding point of contact. They work closely with parents and carers to help ensure every child feels safe, supported, and ready to learn.

Some of the ways our HSLW can help include:

- Offering advice and support with parenting, routines, and behaviour
 - Connecting families with local services and resources
 - Supporting attendance and helping overcome barriers to learning
- Helping families through times of change or difficulty (e.g., bereavement, family breakdown)
 - Building positive relationships between home and school

They are available for informal chats, one-to-one support, or just a listening ear when needed.

Our HSLW is here to make sure no family feels alone – we are all part of the same team, working together for our children's well-being and success.
