What is the time commitment?

The Governing Body meets once every half term (ie 6 times per academic year on Tuesday evenings) to discuss and review strategic decisions. In addition, some prep work is required including reviewing documents and visiting the school when appropriate. There is also a need for some basic training.

What do Governors do?

Governors sit on the Governing Body, whose purpose is to help our pupils and staff to achieve the very best. We do this by partnering with the senior leadership team and staff to set the strategic direction for the school, focusing on its ongoing development, monitoring performance/progress and ensuring financial integrity.

What skills/knowledge do you need?

You don't need to be an "expert" - Governor Induction courses are available for new governors. We actively seek governors with a diverse range of skills and experiences. What matters most is your commitment to want to make a difference to the school.
