Values

LOVE

Love is the core value that underpins all that we do at Shrivenham CE Primary School. We show love to everyone by putting others before ourselves. By working together as part of a strong and supportive family, we can all achieve more - socially, emotionally and academically.

HOPE

Hope is a core value for our church school because we share in the joy that comes from the belief that there is always hope and all is never lost. Hope is an attitude of mind that we develop through faith in God and each other. In our school this helps it to keep going even when things get hard and when we face new challenges. Together we can turn hope into reality.

COURAGE

Courage is a core value for our church school because God asks us to be brave in the face of hardship. The book of Joshua reminds us to stand against injustice and to be the best we can be when things are difficult. At our school, we have courage to stand by our beliefs and are committed to what is right and true.

We know that successful partnership working with parents / carers will make a positive impact on children's learning. The School

- Work alongside and inform parents of their children's learning and progress at regular intervals.
- Provide a safe, friendly and happy environment.
- Facilitate a smooth transition through the phases of education.
- Encourage children to show friendship and respect for others.

Parents/Carers

Parents and Carers will:

- Support their child's learning at home and at school.
- Endeavour to read every day with their child at home.
- Reinforce the school's high expectations of behaviour, including at the beginning and end of the day and in after-school clubs.

- Attend meetings at school e.g. Parent - teacher meetings / curriculum information sessions whenever possible.
- Show support for school community events.
- Support their child to come to school in the correct uniform and bring the correct equipment (PE kit).
- Show consideration and respect for the school and local environment.
- Ensure that their child attends school during term time and provide an explanation when their child is absent.
- Ensure punctual attendance at school.
- Read communications from school and act on them when necessary.
- Inform the school of any circumstances which may affect your child in school.

Pupils

Pupils will:

- Work hard in their learning and strive do their best.
- Uphold our values.
- Behave respectfully towards other children.
- Do what adults at the school ask.
- Care for their own and other people's property, including that belonging to the school.
- Complete all homework tasks set.

- Wear our school uniform smartly.
